### **Dr Yaron Avitzur**

#### Paediatric Gastroenterologist SickKids Hospital, University of Toronto, CANADA

Dr. Yaron Avitzur is a Professor of Paediatrics at the University of Toronto and Medical Director, Intestinal Rehabilitation and Transplantation in the Transplant and Regenerative Medicine Centre, Division of Gastroenterology, Hepatology and Nutrition at The Hospital for Sick Children (SickKids). He is also the Medical Director of the Joint Program in Intestinal Transplantation at University Health Network and SickKids.

Dr. Avitzur graduated in medicine from Sackler Faculty of Medicine at Tel-Aviv University, Israel and completed Paediatric residency at Schneider Children's Medical Center of Israel. He was licensed as a Paediatric Gastroenterologist in 2005 after a dual fellowship in Paediatric Gastroenterology and Paediatric Academic Multi-Organ Transplantation (PAMOT) at SickKids.

Dr. Avitzur's clinical and research interest is within the fields of

Intestinal Failure and Intestine and Liver Transplantation. His work is focused on the improvement of outcomes and quality of life of his patients through clinical innovation, policy making and international collaborations.

guidelines and policy in relation to

intestinal failure and liver and intestine transplantation.

working in the field and advocates for equitable access to knowledge and services for patients with intestinal failure around the world.
